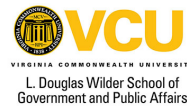

Mission

The Urban Affairs Association is dedicated to creating interdisciplinary spaces for engaging in intellectual and practical discussions about urban life. Through theoretical, empirical, and action-oriented research, the UAA fosters diverse activities to understand and shape a more just and equitable urban world. (Adopted March 12, 2010)

History

UAA is the successor organization to the Council of University Institutes for Urban Affairs, formed in Boston in 1969 by a group of directors of university urban programs. As urban affairs developed as a professional and academic field, the need for an organization that welcomed urban faculty, professionals, and students as well as urban program directors and deans became increasingly apparent. In recognition of this need, in 1981 the organization's name was changed to the Urban Affairs Association. Today, UAA includes over 600 institutional, individual, and student members from colleges and universities throughout North America, South America, Europe, Africa, Australia and Asia. Among its other activities, UAA sponsors the *Journal of Race, Ethnicity, and the City*, which serves as an outlet for ground-breaking theoretical and empirical approaches that explore race, ethnicity, identity and social justice, and the *Journal of Urban Affairs*, a refereed annual journal, publishing manuscripts related to urban research and policy analysis of interest to both scholars and practitioners. All UAA members receive the *Journal of Urban Affairs and the Journal of Race, Ethnicity, and the City* as part of their membership fee. UAA also sponsors Upsilon Sigma - The Urban Studies Honor Society. Upsilon Sigma is dedicated to recognizing and encouraging excellence in scholarship, leadership, and engagement in urban studies and related fields. The mission is to promote academic excellence and enrich the educational experience of undergraduate and graduate students pursuing degrees related to urban studies.

The Urban Affairs Association hosts a conference each spring in an urban center. Recent conferences have taken place in Miami, San Diego, Minneapolis, Toronto, Canada, and Los Angeles. The next UAA conference will occur in Nashville, Tennessee (2023). These yearly conferences are an integral part of UAA's efforts to increase knowledge about urban places and promote the development of research activities. They provide an excellent opportunity for members to exchange ideas, information, and experiences. The conference program features both topics of institutional concern and those related to urban issues. Each year, formal research papers are presented, with selected papers published in the *Journal of Urban Affairs*. Additionally, the conference format allows opportunities for informal activities designed to foster professional networking and open discussion.

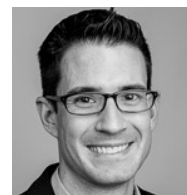

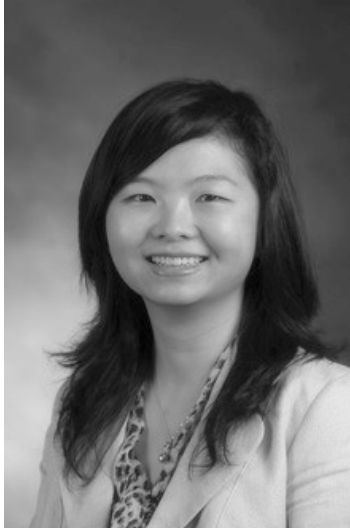

Cathy Yang Liu
Georgia State University

Cathy Yang Liu is a Professor and Chair of Department of Public Management and Policy at the Andrew Young School of Policy Studies, Georgia State University. She directs and teaches in the Planning and Economic Development Concentration in its degree programs. She conducts research and publishes widely in the areas of community and economic development, urban labor market and inequality, migration and entrepreneurship, as well as international urban development. Her edited book “Immigrant Entrepreneurship in Cities: Global Perspectives” was published by Springer in 2021. She received her MPP from the University of Chicago and Ph.D. in Planning from the University of Southern California.

Dr. Liu has been actively involved in UAA conferences from 2007 and serves as GSU’s institutional representative from 2012. Her recent service activities include member of Best Conference Paper Award Committee (2013-4), Conference Program Committee (2016-7, 2017-8), and Ad Hoc Journal Committee (2018). She was Chair of the Asia/Pacific Special Track Committee (2015-6 and 2018-9) as well as Chair of the Governing Board Nominations Committee (2020-1). In addition, she currently serves as a Senior Associate Editor for Journal of Urban Affairs (previously Managing Editor from 2016 to 2021).



José Meléndez
University of Oregon

Dr. Meléndez is Assistant Professor of Planning for Engaging Diverse Communities at the University of Oregon’s School of Planning, Public Policy, and Management. Trained as a learning scientist/urban planner at the University of Illinois at Chicago, his research applies concepts and methods typically associated with the learning sciences to investigate planning contexts where findings inform and expand related practice and theory. Specifically, Dr. Meléndez’ research centers on the design of participatory and decision-making processes, to identify how language usage and tools, modes of participation, and the inclusion of new participants in these processes impact one another and influence process, policy, and learning outcomes.

Dr. Meléndez has been a UAA member since 2014. As a Ph.D. student, he attended his first conference and found his home community which has been instrumental to his professional development. From

2016-2019, he served on the Ad Hoc Committee on UAA Honor Society, tasked with creating UAA's Upsilon Sigma. In 2018, Dr. Meléndez founded, and has since coordinated, the Teaching Effectiveness Academy for UAA, consisting of half-day professional development workshops for instructors. Finally, during the Covid-19 shutdown, Dr. Meléndez was a panelist for two of UAA virtual professional development pane



Rachael Woldoff
West Virginia University

Rachael A. Woldoff is an urban sociologist and Professor of Sociology at West Virginia University. She received a PhD in sociology from The Ohio State University, specializing in crime and community. Her work focuses on neighborhood crime and disorder, urban redevelopment, and racial/ethnic differences in neighborhood attainment, as well as the subjects of neighborhood racial change, gentrification, housing affordability, and creative class cities. Her research has appeared in *Social Forces*, *Urban Affairs Review*, and *Urban Studies*. Her book, *White Flight/Black Flight: The Dynamics of Racial Change in an American Neighborhood*, was awarded the UAA Best Book Award. Dr. Woldoff received the Eberly College of Arts and Sciences Outstanding Researcher Award. She has coauthored three other books including *High Stakes: Big Time Sports and Downtown Redevelopment* and *Priced Out: Stuyvesant Town and the Loss of Middle-Class Neighborhoods*. She is Deputy Editor of the journal *City & Community* and is Chair of the American Sociological Association's Community and Urban Sociology Section (CUSS). Her newest book, *Digital Nomads: In Search of Freedom, Community, and Meaningful Work in the New Economy* (Oxford University Press 2021), examines community, creative class cities, and the rise of remote work.

Rachael has served on UAA's conference Host Committee and Book Award Development Committee, and she has delivered a seminar on book publishing for UAA.

Norman Krumholz
(Cleveland State University)
Emeritus Professor of Urban Planning at the
Maxine Goodman Levin College of Urban Affairs



BRIEF BIO

"Norman Krumholz left an indelible mark on the city of Cleveland and the Cleveland State University (CSU) campus. His contributions to how we learn and teach neighborhood-building, community development, and city revitalization will impact us and future generations for many years to come.

Krumholz joined CSU in 1979 as founding Director of the Center for Neighborhood Development (CND) and spent the next 40 years educating multiple generations of urban planners. He and his staff were instrumental in supporting and expanding the network of community development corporations dedicated to neighborhood revitalization. This led to the formation in 1981 of the Cleveland Housing Network, which became a national model for the rehabilitation of housing for low-income tenants and for helping many of them become homeowners. Prior to joining the Levin College, Krumholz worked as an urban planning practitioner in Ithaca, Pittsburgh, and Cleveland, where he served in the mayoral administrations of Ralph J. Perk, Dennis Kucinich, and Carl Stokes."

BRIEF BIO

"Among his academic distinctions, Dr. Robert Lang was a Fulbright Fellow at the École Normale Supérieure in Paris in 2008, a Visiting Distinguished Professor at Arizona State University in 2006, and more recently, a Planning and Development Fellow of the Lincoln Institute of Land Policy in Cambridge, MA, and a Distinguished Visiting Fellow of the University of California, Riverside. He received his Ph.D. from Rutgers University in 2002.

Dr. Lang served as editor of several academic journals, including Housing Policy Debate and the Journal of the American Planning Association. His research specialties included suburban studies, real estate, demographic and spatial analysis, economic development, and metropolitan governance. He authored over 150 academic and professional publications on a wide range of topics and developed many new urban planning concepts such as "boomburbs," "edgeless cities," and "megapolitan areas."

Dr. Lang was in wide demand for his expertise, giving over 250 professional and academic talks and managing over 14 million dollars in research and foundation grants during his career. His research was featured in such outlets as USA Today, the New York Times, the Washington Post, and the Wall Street Journal, and reported on by NPR, CNN, MSNBC, FOX News, and ABC World News Tonight. His publications included the books *Edgeless Cities: Exploring the Elusive Metropolis* (2003), *Boomburbs: The Rise of America's Accidental Cities* (2007), and *The New Politics of Planning* (2009)."

BRIEF BIO

"Dr. Fritz Wagner will be remembered as an educator and mentor, as well as civic and administrative leader, most notably as the founding Dean of the College of Urban and Public Affairs at the University of New Orleans, where he spent most of his career. Dr. Wagner's interests ranged from land use/legal aspects of urban planning to health policy across urban and rural communities in developed and developing countries. He published numerous articles on urban planning and co-edited four volumes on urban revitalization, including: *Urban Revitalization: Programs and Policies* (1995), *Managing Capital Resources for Central City Revitalization* (2000) and *Community Livability* (2012).

Dr. Wagner was a fixture at UAA conferences, having attended annual meetings since 1977. Throughout his engagement in UAA, he was a service leader, organizing sessions and roundtables, mentoring junior colleagues, and contributing to countless committees. He was twice elected to the UAA Governing Board, serving from 1989 to 1995. He holds a unique place in UAA history as one of only three UAA members to serve on two different local host committees (1994-New Orleans; 2009-Seattle) in our 50-year conference history. In 2013, Dr. Wagner was inducted into the UAA Distinguished Service Honor Roll in recognition of his many years of dedication to the organization. UAA conferences will never be quite the same without his welcoming presence."

BRIEF BIO

"For a quarter century, Dr. Janet Smith's teaching, research and community service focused on equity issues in housing planning and policy. Her research and outreach activities were regularly conducted in partnership with community organizations and policy stakeholders through the Voorhees Center at UIC.

Her work involved issues that range from the transformation of public housing projects throughout the U.S. and the expansion of housing options for people with disabilities to the relationship between housing and health, and community-driven strategies to keep housing costs affordable.

Dr. Smith led several large-scale housing research projects in Chicago including a regional homeless needs assessments, rental market studies funded by the Department of Housing and Urban Development. Along with Larry Bennett and Patricia Wright, Janet co-edited and co-authored *Where are Poor People to Live? Transforming Public Housing Communities* (ME Sharpe 2006). She and John Betancur also published *Claiming Neighborhood: New Ways of Understanding Urban Change* (University of Illinois 2016).

The impact of her work earned Janet several honors, including the Urban Affairs Association's 2020 Marilyn J. Gittell Activist Scholar Award for her "truly outstanding ... contributions and commitment to activist-scholarship."

Dr. Smith received her bachelor's and master's degrees at UIUC before earning a Ph.D. at Cleveland State University."

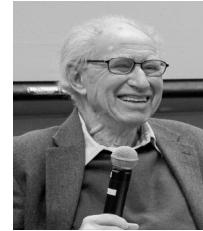

“Peter Marcuse (Columbia University)
Professor Emeritus of Urban Planning
Graduate School of Architecture, Planning and
Preservation



BRIEF BIO

“Dr. Peter Marcuse was born in Berlin in 1928 and moved to Switzerland before immigrating to the U.S. with his family in 1934. After graduating from Harvard College in 1948, he attended Yale Law School where he earned his J.D. in 1953 and afterward practiced law in New Haven and Waterbury, Connecticut. He later earned Master’s degrees in Public Law and Government from Columbia University in 1963, and in Urban Studies from Yale University in 1968. After completing his Ph.D. dissertation *Home Ownership for Low-Income Families: Legal and Financial Implications* in 1972 at the University of California in Berkeley, Peter joined the UCLA planning faculty.

Peter relocated to New York City in 1975 to direct the Urban Planning Program at Columbia GSAPP, where he introduced a strong programmatic emphasis on issues of urban social equity and social justice. Since the 1970s, these topics have suffused the curriculum. Even today, the program emphasizes issues of economic development, environmental sustainability, reconnection with physical planning, community participation, advocacy planning, and concepts of social justice. Peter was one of the first to define and use the term gentrification, as well as many other names and phrases to define and distinguish ideas and concepts. Always engaged in civic activities, Peter served on and chaired a Manhattan community board, served on the American Civil Liberties Union’s board of directors, and led New York City’s triennial study of housing conditions in 1978 alongside his position at Columbia University.

Peter wrote prolifically, even after his retirement. Recent writings include *Searching for a Just City: Debates in Urban Theory and Practice* (2009), *Cities for People, Not for Profit* (2011), *In Defense of Housing* (2016), and his blog *Critical Planning & Other Thoughts*.“

Shaping the Future of Urban Research: The State of Urban Affairs and the State of Urban Affairs Research

This plenary discusses Urban Affairs as a field of study and node of knowledge production, the state of cities (their conditions), and the intersections between these phenomena. The session examines the role of research, scholarship, and knowledge generally in urban policymaking, advocacy, and social movements. The speakers will reflect on the past 50 years, as well as current and future challenges.

Moderator: George Galster, Wayne State University

George Galster earned his Ph.D. in Economics from M.I.T. and is the Clarence Hilberry Professor of Urban Affairs, emeritus at Wayne State University, Detroit. He has published 168 peer-reviewed articles, 10 books and 44 book chapters on a wide range of topics. He has been a consultant to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, U.S. Department of Justice, numerous municipalities, community organizations, civil rights groups, and organizations like Fannie Mae, American Bankers Association and National Association of Realtors. He has served on the Consumer Advisory Council of the Federal Reserve's Board of Governors, National Academy of Science review committees, and numerous other positions in community service. He has provided housing policy consultations in Australia, Canada, China, Scotland, and the U.S. The Urban Affairs Association placed him on their "Service Honor Roll" in 2014 and awarded him the "Contributions to the Field of Urban Affairs" prize in 2016.



Speaker: Ali Modarres, University of Washington



Ali Modarres is the Dean of the School of Urban Studies and the Assistant Chancellor for Community Engagement at University of Washington Tacoma. Prior to that, he served as the Chair of the Department of Geosciences and Environment at California State University, Los Angeles, and Associate Director/Director of Research at the Edmund G. "Pat" Brown Institute of Public Affairs. From 2009 to 2017, he served as the Editor-in-Chief of *Cities: The International Journal of Urban Policy and Planning*.

Dr. Modarres earned his Ph.D. in geography from the University of Arizona and

holds masters and bachelors degrees in landscape architecture from the same

institution. He has published in the areas of social geography, immigration, transportation, urban development, planning, and policy. In addition to books, book chapters, and peer-reviewed articles, Dr. Modarres has continuously published in the public domain through applied research reports, policy papers, policy briefs, and opinion pieces, as well as delivering a large number of policy-focused lectures. This includes over 40 engaged-scholarship publications and over 100 public lectures over the course of his academic career.

Dr. Modarres serves on a number of governing and advisory boards of academic associations, nonprofits, and policy centers, including Economic Roundtable (Los Angeles), Forterra Strong Communities Fund, Earth Economics, Goodwill of the Olympics and Rainier Region, and the Greater Tacoma Community Foundation. He has also served on city task forces and committees, including the Affordable Housing Technical Advisory Group for the City of Tacoma. Over the last five years, he has also helped create a regional dialogue around important urban policy issues facing the South Puget Sound. As a part of this effort, he has provided applied research and urban analytics support to various jurisdictions. Throughout his academic career, he has built bridges between university and community, promoting, and supporting the mission of urban serving universities.

As part of his academic services, he serves on the advisory board for Palgrave's book series on Demography and Political and Social Change in the MENA region (Middle East and North Africa) and Springer's Urban Book series. He also serves on the editorial boards of the Journal of Urban Affairs and Cities. He is one of the two founding editors of the new journal of Race, Ethnicity, and the City

Speaker: Margery Austin Turner, Urban Institute



Margery Turner is an Institute fellow at the Urban Institute, focusing on new research and policy programs. She previously served 10 years as Urban's senior vice president for program planning and management and 11 years as director of the Metropolitan Housing and Communities Policy Center. A nationally recognized expert on urban policy and neighborhood issues, Turner has analyzed issues of residential location, racial and ethnic discrimination and its contribution to neighborhood segregation and inequality, and the role of housing policies in promoting residential mobility and location choice. Among her publica-

tions is the book *Public Housing and Legacy of Segregation*.

Turner served as deputy assistant secretary for research at the US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) from 1993 through 1996, focusing HUD's research agenda on the problems of racial discrimination, concentrated poverty, and economic opportunity in America's metropolitan areas. During her tenure, HUD's research office launched three major social science demonstration projects to test different strategies for helping families from distressed inner-city neighborhoods gain access to opportunities through employment and education.

Turner has a BA in political science from Cornell University and an MA in urban and regional planning from the George Washington University.

Speaker: Margaret Weir, Brown University

Margaret Weir is Wilson Professor of Political Science and Public Affairs at Brown University. Weir is the author and editor of several books, including *Who Gets What? The New Politics of Insecurity* (co-edited with Frances Rosenbluth (Cambridge University Press 2021); *Building Resilient Regions* (Urban and Regional Policy and its Effects, Vol. IV) (coedited with Nancy Pindus, Howard Wial, and Harold Wolman, Brookings Institution Press, 2012); *Politics and Jobs: The*



Boundaries of Employment Policy in the United States (Princeton University Press, 1993); and (with Ira Katznelson), *Schooling for All: Race, Class and the Decline of the Democratic Ideal* (Basic Books 1985). She served as director of the MacArthur foundation's Research Network Building Resilient Regions. She is currently working on a book entitled *The New Metropolis: Political Power and Spatial Inequality in Twenty-First Century America*. Parts of this project have been published in the *Urban Affairs Review*, *Regional Studies*, and *Perspectives on Politics*. Weir is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and the National Academy of Social Insurance. In 2020, she received the Norton Long Career Achievement Award from the American Political Science Association's Urban and Local Politics Section.

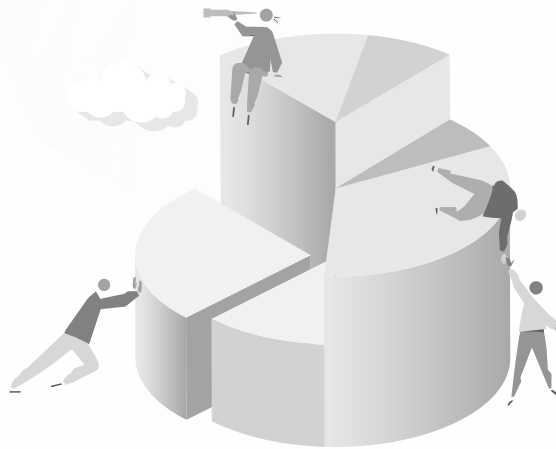

Important Information Regarding Name Badges and Tickets

Comprehensive vs Basic Registration

There are two categories of registration at a UAA Conference: Comprehensive and Basic. Comprehensive is the higher rate and includes all meals, coffee breaks, and receptions. The Basic registration category includes coffee breaks but no meals or receptions.

All UAA registration badges have a front that is basically the same and lists your name, affiliation and any UAA service role.

The back of the UAA registration badge varies and reflects your registration category. If you paid the higher Comprehensive Registration fees, on the back of your badge is a list of meals and receptions that you are entitled to attend. If you paid the Basic registration rate, the back of your badge will be blank.

All meal and reception events require that you show your badge at the entrance to the event. All event entrances are monitored, and badges are checked before you enter. We do not sell tickets at the door. You can purchase tickets to an event if space is available. Ticket purchases can be made at the UAA On-site Registration Desk via credit card.

To attend Breakfast Roundtables, you must have a Comprehensive badge or purchase a breakfast ticket.

Presentation Guidelines and Session Room Equipment

Time Structure of Sessions. Panel sessions are 90 minutes long. Within each session, approximately 15-20 minutes will be reserved for open discussion. In sessions with five presenters, each presenter is allotted 10 minutes. In sessions with three or four presenters, each presenter is allotted 12 minutes. It is best to plan on 10 minutes regardless of the number of presenters since last minute changes in the panel could affect your allotted time.

Presenters are encouraged to arrive a few minutes prior to their session in order to test their presentation. Audio-visual technical assistants will be on call to provide any necessary support.

Audio-visual Set-Up. Each conference session room is equipped with a laptop, screen, and LCD projector. If you wish to use PowerPoint (not required) for your presentation, please save your file to a portable USB flash drive. If you are building your slides via KeyNote on a Mac computer, please convert your file to Microsoft PowerPoint and save to your flash drive.

UAA Moderator Guidelines

Thanks for accepting this important responsibility! Your role as moderator is essential to the success of each conference session. Each presenter is counting on you to manage your session in an efficient and organized manner. Attendees really value well-managed sessions.

Moderators are primarily responsible for 1) introductions, 2) keeping the time, and alerting presenters of remaining minutes, and 3) managing the open discussion period. Here are some helpful hints on how to be an effective UAA session moderator.

Important “Do’s”

1. Arrive at least 10 minutes prior to the start of your session. If another session is wrapping up in the room, please stand at the back of the room until the session ends.
2. Prior to the start of the session, ask each presenter to upload any PowerPoint files to the desktop of the computer found in the room.
3. Check to make sure the time management signs are in the session room. If they are not, you may wish to ask an audience member to go to the UAA Registration Office to get a pair of signs. Do remember to leave these signs in the room for the next session.
4. Please start your session at the official starting time. Introduce the session by its title. You may make a simple statement regarding the main topics covered by the papers. Limit this statement to 1 minute.
5. Introduce the first speaker and that person’s paper title.
6. Make a note to yourself of the person’s starting time and anticipated ending time.
7. When 5 minutes remain in the talk, show the speaker the 5-minute yellow warning sign. Likewise, when 1 minute remains, show the person the 1-minute red warning sign. If the time is exhausted and the speaker has not finished, show the time expired sign and then rise from your chair and approach the speaker to end the talk.
8. Proceed to introduce the second speaker and follow the same instructions listed above.
9. Once all speakers have completed their presentations, invite the audience to ask questions. Note the time that the Q&A begins and when the session must conclude.
10. If the Q&A discussion slows down, consider asking questions based on your own interpretation or interests.

Important “Don’ts”

1. Do not wait for a crowd to form. Start the session on time.
2. Do not change the order of the papers listed in the conference program. Audience members often plan their arrival and departure based on the order listed in the program.
3. Do not allow discussion and questions between presentations. A few minutes lost between papers can create a time shortage for open discussion, or worse, may reduce the time available for the last presenter.
4. Although some conferences use discussants for sessions, UAA does not. The role of the moderator is to manage the session. Do not use your role as an opportunity to make assessments of each presentation.
5. Do not dominate the Q&A period by asking your questions first. Let the audience have the first chance to pose questions.

What you will find in the session room

Time Management Signs--To assist you in maintaining the timeframe of your session, UAA will supply several signs (i.e., a 5-minute warning sign, a 1-minute warning sign, and a time-expired sign) for your use in alerting speakers of their remaining time. You will find these signs in your session room. If they are not in the room, please visit the UAA registration desk for assistance.

Audio-Visual Resources--Each session room will be equipped with a screen, a laptop computer with PowerPoint software, and an LCD projector. A-V technicians will be on-call in the hotel during sessions.

Other Important Information

- Panel sessions are 90 minutes long.
- Within each session, approximately 15-20 minutes should be reserved for open discussion.
- In sessions with five presenters, each presenter is allotted 10 minutes.
- In sessions with three or four presenters, each presenter is allocated 12 minutes.

Keep in mind that introductions and transitions between each speaker do take time (as much as 2-4 minutes).

Access to Papers

Please ask each presenter to state whether interested persons may access the paper. If access is available, the author should state how to obtain the paper.



Submit Your Paper for the 2022 Best Conference Paper Award

*Deadline: July 15, 2022

This award is presented to the author(s) of the paper judged to be the best paper presented at the Urban Affairs Association's (UAA) conference. The recipient(s) receives a total honorarium of \$1000, an award plaque and complimentary conference registration. The award is presented one year after the original conference presentation.

All conference papers submitted for review to the *Journal of Urban Affairs* (JUA) are eligible for the award. Papers are subjected to the normal JUA review process, and finalists are determined by composite review comments. The award winner is selected by an ad hoc committee designated by the chair of the Governing Board. The committee reports its decision to the Executive Director and the Chairperson of the Board. The Executive Director informs the award recipient of the outcome.

Papers that are accepted for publication through the review process will appear in a subsequent issue of the JUA.

Urban Affairs Association: A 50-Year History

A Brief Summary

Institutional Origins

The first meeting of the **Council of University Institutes for Urban Affairs (CUIUA)** – what is now the **Urban Affairs Association (UAA)** – was held in Detroit, Michigan (USA) in the spring of 1969. A few months later, a second meeting was held in Boston, Massachusetts (USA). The purpose of these meetings, which were largely among directors of urban research institutes, was to formulate strategies to promote the survival and growth of urban research centers, and urban affairs degree programs. In the context of 1969, university-based urban institutes were a significant development for institutions of higher education. Their existence marked academia's efforts to engage the wide-sweeping challenges confronting cities across the United States. It also signaled the creation of a new multi-disciplinary area of study – that of urban affairs.

The objectives of CUIUA were fourfold:

1. Promote policies and procedures that facilitate urban affairs education, training, service, basic research, as well as applied research.
2. Create a forum for those engaged in developing and administering urban affairs programs to foster the exchange of experiences, information, and problem-solving efforts related to program establishment and survival.
3. Act as a clearinghouse by collecting and disseminating urban affairs information and research findings. This included research on both urbanism and processes of urbanization.
4. Establish and nurture the field of urban affairs, both as a profession and academic discipline.

As its efforts gained traction and its membership began to evolve, the CUIUA board deliberated over whether it should continue its focus on supporting administrators or shift to offer individual scholars an outlet for presenting their work. Ultimately, the founders decided to focus on creating a forum for individual scholars to engage in academic debate. This marked the Association's transition from an organization of institutes to one of individuals. UAA evolved from this shift with a fundamental priority to generate knowledge in service to urban communities.

From Disciplinary Margins to an Urban Interdisciplinary Core

UAA offers an intellectual home to scholars whose research and teaching focus on the full range of urban issues. According to interviews with past and current UAA members, including those who have served in leadership roles, many scholars came to UAA from the margins of their home disciplines. As urbanists, they often struggled to find likeminded colleagues and audiences for their research. The occasional special journal issues and conference content related to urban affairs found in other disciplines were insufficient for the needs they recognized. Some urban-focused scholars were explicitly told that their work lacked legitimacy in their field. In finding UAA, many consistently attest to the relief, validation, and encouragement they discovered. For many of these scholars, they had finally found their true intellectual home.

Proactive Membership

While many disciplines and professions were clearly relevant to the study of the city, including public administration, political science, history, geography, economics, education, social work, and sociology, CUIUA's board was adamant that no single discipline become dominant. CUIUA saw the input and perspective of all affiliated disciplines and professions as valuable and much needed, as each had intersecting interests and expertise that was crucial to understanding cities. CUIUA's Governing Board knew that organizational autonomy would allow for the preservation of its interdisciplinary nature, which was integral to its driving goals. From its earliest days, the Governing Board actively sought to create a diverse membership. Indeed, two of the original 9 Board members were faculty from Howard University and Morgan State University, both HBCUs. That basic philosophy of diversity of people and disciplines has driven a multi-decade effort. Through its conference, journals, and service roles, UAA has sought to broaden the participation of previously under-represented groups, especially women, people of color, students, and international scholars. This high-level inclusion has had a profound effect on the resulting membership and conference attendance. One initiative designed to attract more students at the earliest stages of their academic career is Upsilon Sigma-the Urban Studies Honor Society, founded in 2018. The Honor Society now has 16 chapters at universities across the U.S. and is expected to grow and attract more students to UAA and urban affairs in general.

Many UAA members have noted that the Association does an exceptional job at engaging members when they are students and junior faculty. The Association's open and collaborative environment is exponentially valuable in this regard, as a supportive environment is one that encourages the work of young scholars, which ultimately benefits the field of urban affairs. UAA members have shared countless anecdotes of their first attendance at a UAA conference as a student, or of bringing their students to the conference for the first time.

The Annual Conference

One of the most valuable services that the Association offers to its membership and the urban affairs discipline is its annual conference. In its early years, drawing 50 to 100 attendees was considered successful. UAA conferences were often held in smaller cities such as Akron, Omaha, and Flint. UAA has since seen conference attendance exceed 1,000, with scholars traveling from across the globe to attend the Association's annual meeting in cities across the U.S. and Canada. The conference has now far outgrown the accommodations available in smaller cities.

Current and past members have repeatedly shared that the conference offers a venue for a type of academic discussion and debate that is hard to find elsewhere. Attendees speak of how each conference provides opportunities to network and many members leave re-energized about their work. Conference attendees often discover models to follow in UAA that guide them in studying the city, doing interdisciplinary work, and conducting research within a social justice-based framework, models that often do not exist in their primary disciplines.

At traditional, long-established academic conferences, a scholar's work is tested and scrutinized. Within the UAA conference context, however, scholars provide contrasting contributions to their colleagues' work. Rather than serve as a pressure test, presenting one's work at UAA tends to draw alternative perspectives to consider and explore, with the shared objective of better understanding urban phenomena. Within this environment, participants' views are broadened because they are exposed to the interpretations and expertise of their colleagues who are trained in disciplines other than their own. This in turn has created a culture where all feel welcomed and valued. In fact, most, if not all, UAA conference attendees often describe the UAA conference as: a welcoming and open interdisciplinary space.

Discussions led by active Board members Robin Hambleton, Arturo Flores, and Jill Gross, stimulated interests in collaborative initiatives with European researchers. In the early 2000s, a special Board committee was formed to encourage “international linkages.” UAA financially supported a set of small meetings that ultimately led to the founding of the European Urban Research Association (EURA). This momentum contributed to a series of City Futures conferences held jointly with EURA. Later in 2013, UAA launched its first regionally focused conference tracks (i.e., Urban Issues in Asia and the Pacific Rim, and in Central and South America). These tracks, supported over years by proactive members Cathy Liu and Cecilia Giusti, dramatically increased conference attendance from China, South Korea, Japan, India, Australia, Brazil, Peru, Mexico, and other parts of the world.

Irrespective of disciplinary or national backgrounds, UAA Conference attendees immediately have a starting point for substantive networking and collaboration, given their intellectual object of interest - urban. This creates a framework wherein scholars from different disciplines can work together to make relevant contributions, while maintaining the character of each scholar's discipline. Whether during sessions, between sessions, or at receptions, the unique UAA conference culture broadens attendees' perspective and exposes them to disciplinary viewpoints that they may not otherwise encounter.

The Journals

The Governing Board's consideration of the value and need for academic journal affiliation began in 1970, its first year. By 1981, the Board had committed to publishing a journal by merging two existing publications – The Urban Interest and Urban Affairs Papers. That year, the association came to an agreement with Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University to publish the *Journal of Urban Affairs* (JUA). Consistent with the interdisciplinary nature of UAA, the Board and university host agreed that the editorial board of JUA would represent a diversity of disciplines, interests, and geographies to the greatest extent possible. As early as 1984, the UAA Board and JUA Editor were taking a critical look at the composition and rotation process of the JUA Editorial Board. Initially, this entailed ensuring that UAA Board members were rotating on and off. Later this would focus on geographical representation, with an interest in increasing international members.

Much of JUA's early growth and solid reputation has been attributed to a 17-year period of stable editorship led by Scott Cummings that culminated in a #1 ranking among urban journals globally. Subsequent editors-Victoria Basolo, Laura Reese, and Igor Vojnovic, built upon this foundation, strategically expanding the journal's international reach and inclusion of work from an increasingly diverse community of scholars. A new editorial period has begun with Bernadette Hanlon who has expanded the scholar development infrastructure of JUA and increased guidance to potential authors.

JUA has played a critical role in UAA's life and history. It has provided a third leg to the table that is the discipline of urban affairs, alongside UAA as an association and the annual UAA conference. Each of these key components supports and is supported by the others, which can be seen in stories and testimonials about how one came to be a part of UAA, how UAA and JUA have had an impact on their careers, and why they continued to be involved and get others involved as well. The Association's success in establishing an exceptional journal brought a significant sense of accomplishment, took UAA to a new level of legitimacy, and benefitted the field of urban affairs and urban scholars tremendously.

Having succeeded in initiating and establishing JUA, the Association has developed the capacity to launch a second journal. The journal was initially proposed in 2018 by Executive Director Margaret Wilder, who saw a lack of journals explicitly focused on race and ethnicity. To support the development of a proposal for publication, UAA sponsored a special conference track at the 2019 Los Angeles conference, chaired by Michael Leo Owens, that created interest and a ready pool of papers targeted at the new publication outlet. Launched in 2021, and Co-Edited by Yasminah

Beebeejaun and Ali Modarres, the *Journal of Race, Ethnicity, and the City* (JRE) creates a direct link to UAA's history of supporting scholars engaged in justice-oriented scholarship and activism. Importantly, JRE makes its own contribution to the field of urban affairs by increasing the scale and breadth of scholarship on racial and ethnic justice. As with all its endeavors, UAA continues to evaluate where it is, consider where it could or should be, and actively pursues new opportunities for growth and evolution.

Justice-Engaged Scholarship

UAA has always made a place for urban scholars, as well as those motivated by a desire to improve the quality of life in cities. While applied research and community engagement are widely accepted in higher education today, in the late 1960s when UAA was founded, existing disciplines and university administrations regarded this type of research as “non-intellectual,” “radical,” even “dangerous” to the carefully maintained separation of academics from the political and social issues of their communities. Efforts to preserve this level of justice-engaged scholarship have been seen in UAA's strategic planning processes.

In 2009, while reviewing the Association's strategic objectives, the Governing Board discussed maintaining a focus on justice and equity. It was important in the view of the Board that UAA be explicit in articulating its long-held values and maintaining a connection to its origins. From that discussion grew the consideration to incorporate an annual lecture that could draw in more community activists, a group of interest that underrepresented in the UAA membership.

In 2011, to celebrate the legacy of Marilyn Gittell, a community-engaged scholar and long-time UAA member who had died, UAA established the Activist Scholar Award and conference plenary. This offered a new opportunity to convene those interested in discussing and furthering engaged research. This initial effort led to the establishment of an Activist Scholar Award named in honor of Gittell. Later, UAA sponsored a series of workshops developed by one of the award's early recipients, Kitty Kelly Epstein, designed to encourage new activist research. In 2014, while developing goals for future JUA editors, there was an interest in not merely reaching mainstream benchmarks but ensuring that social justice and other intellectual content was the priority of the journal. This would ensure that the journal had space for research focused on achieving social justice through scholarship.

Challenges and Maturation of the Executive Office

Throughout much of its history, the Association struggled to maintain its existence. But the commitment of its Governing Board, Executive Director, and members carried it forward. Perhaps the greatest single challenge was in 2004, when it was discovered that the Managing Director had embezzled large sums from the Association. It would take until the fall of 2008 before UAA was fully out of the fiscal crisis that resulted from the theft. In the process of recovery, however, the Association grew stronger in remarkable ways. Recognizing that the lack of formal procedures and safeguards made the fraud and theft possible, the Governing Board (led by a series of chairs including Marion Orr, Janet Smith, and Ed Goetz), and interim Executive Director Margaret Wilder developed and institutionalized processes that would ensure thorough documentation and accounting of all Association funds. While 2005 to 2008 was undoubtedly the most difficult in UAA's history, it is undeniable that the Association is stronger today because of 1) how the crisis was quickly and efficiently handled and 2) the steps taken to ensure such an event never occurs again.

The recovery and maturation period continued with an infusion of strategic planning led by Board Chair William Rohe from 2009-2011. What followed was a major transition in 2011 as the Association chose to relocate the Executive Office from its almost four-decades home at the University of Delaware, to the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee (one of UAA's original institutional members). The move marked the beginning of operations as an independent nonprofit

hosted by an institution, as opposed to being embedded within a university infrastructure. A period of operational maturation followed as the staff grew and expanded its range of professional management activities, particularly regarding conference planning and logistics. During the first five years of the new operations, UAA's budget solidified enough to support hiring a full-time Special Assistant, Deidre Beadle, who would later become Assistant Director. Subsequent years led to the hiring of a full-time finance/membership manager in 2015 (Maggie McCollum) and part-time web manager (Megan Bruzan). After four decades of having a staff equivalent of 1 to 1.5 persons, UAA finally had multiple professionals in its Executive Office. The professionalization of the office gave the organization more capacity to manage the entire range of conference planning and logistics, albeit, heavy-loaded. New conference-based professional development workshops were added and coordinated by the staff. The most recent addition of a Communications Manager (i.e., Sue Peacock) is expanding social media and marketing outreach efforts. These collective changes are raising the ability of the organization to meet challenges in the future.

The Association's 50th year, 2020, presented a dramatic challenge: a global pandemic which led to the cancellation of the annual conference both that year and the following (2021). Through lengthy negotiations, the Executive Director successfully navigated a minefield of potential financial impacts due to hotel contract cancellations and reduced revenues. True to form, UAA has responded by seizing this as an opportunity to adapt and grow to meet the significant changes in needs that resulted. In place of the cancelled conferences, UAA launched a new set of professional development activities through periodic online webinars. These initiatives have become institutionalized as part of a new professional development program designed to provide a full menu of developmental and support opportunities, particularly for graduate students and early career researchers.

The Future of UAA

The success of UAA has been attributed to several elements, highlighted in the interviews conducted for this history project. Many cite the format and structure of the conference. For example, incorporating meals and networking receptions into the annual meeting encourages attendees to stay at the conference venue rather than disburse throughout the host city in smaller groups or solo. The size of the conference, though much larger than in UAA's first two decades, is still much smaller than other conferences and maintains a sense of intimacy. As a result, conference attendees, particularly those that attend for multiple years, quickly find familiar faces, and look forward to seeing their UAA colleagues each year.

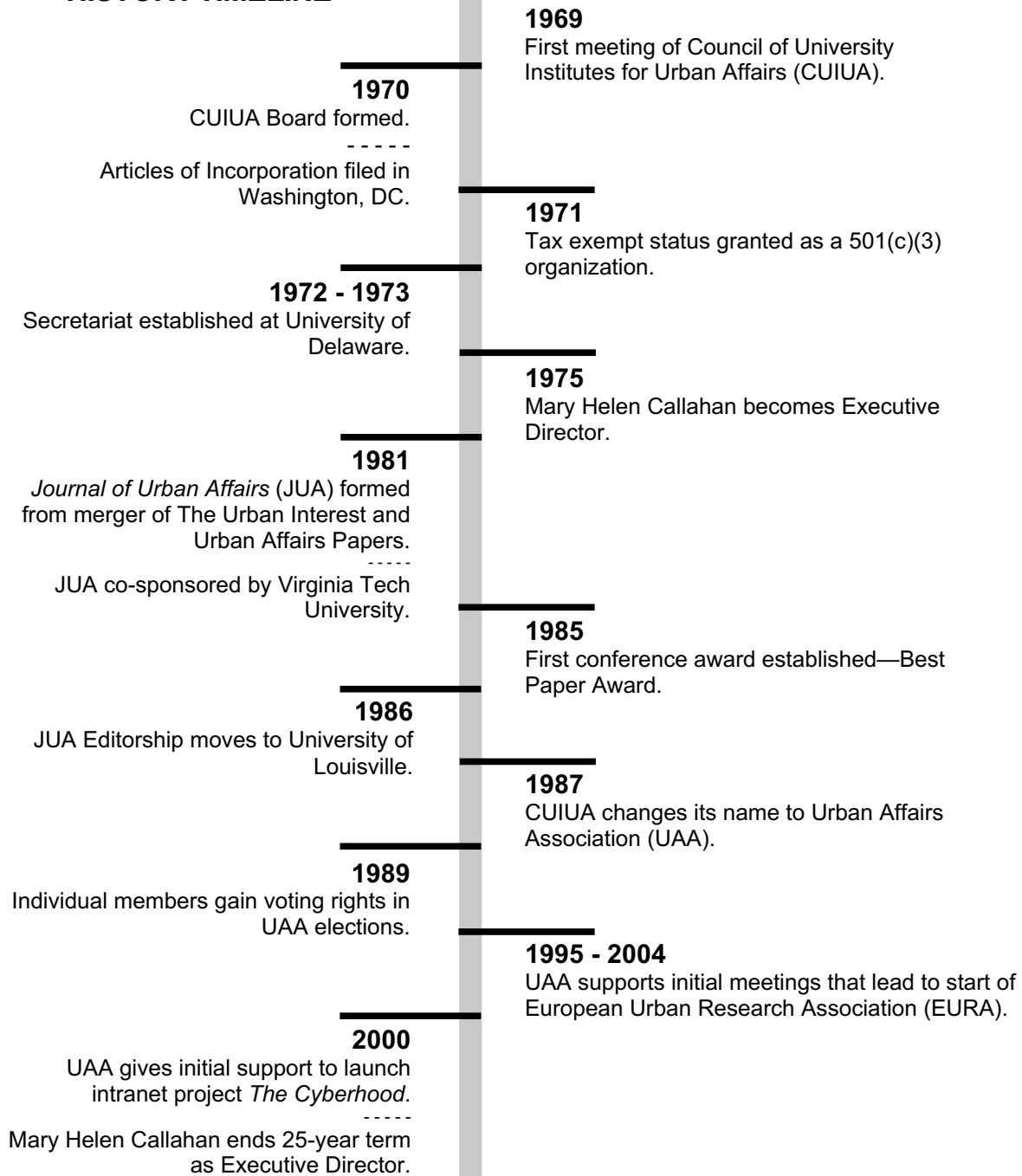
Many attribute the accessibility of UAA due to its interdisciplinary nature, both in the range of perspectives it draws and the contrast it offers to conferences affiliated with single disciplines. UAA is often a secondary conference and field for its members and attendees, which allows for more open collaboration that supplements accomplishments in primary disciplines. UAA offers an accessible venue for scholars in a variety of academic fields interested in studying urban phenomena, including those based in urban affairs. Every year, UAA's membership and conference attendees produce, present, and discuss high quality, innovative, and justice-based research that is interdisciplinary, international, and cutting edge.

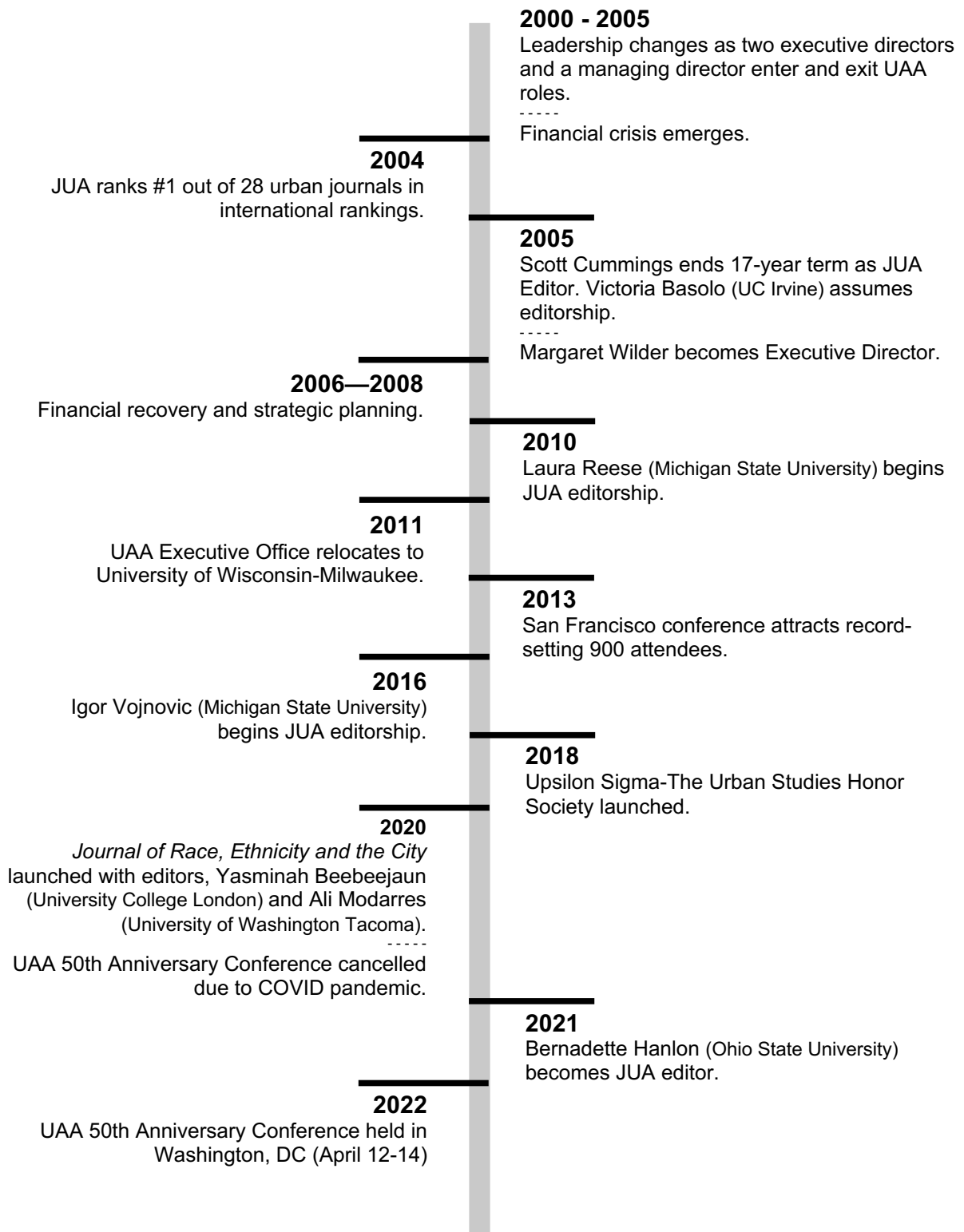
No one can say for certain where the Urban Affairs Association will go from here. To date, despite tremendous growth in the size of the membership and conference, UAA has retained its welcoming character. What is certain is that UAA is not simply an Association, a pair of journals, and a conference, but rather a unique space that serves as an incubator, platform, facilitator, and community for the field of urban affairs.

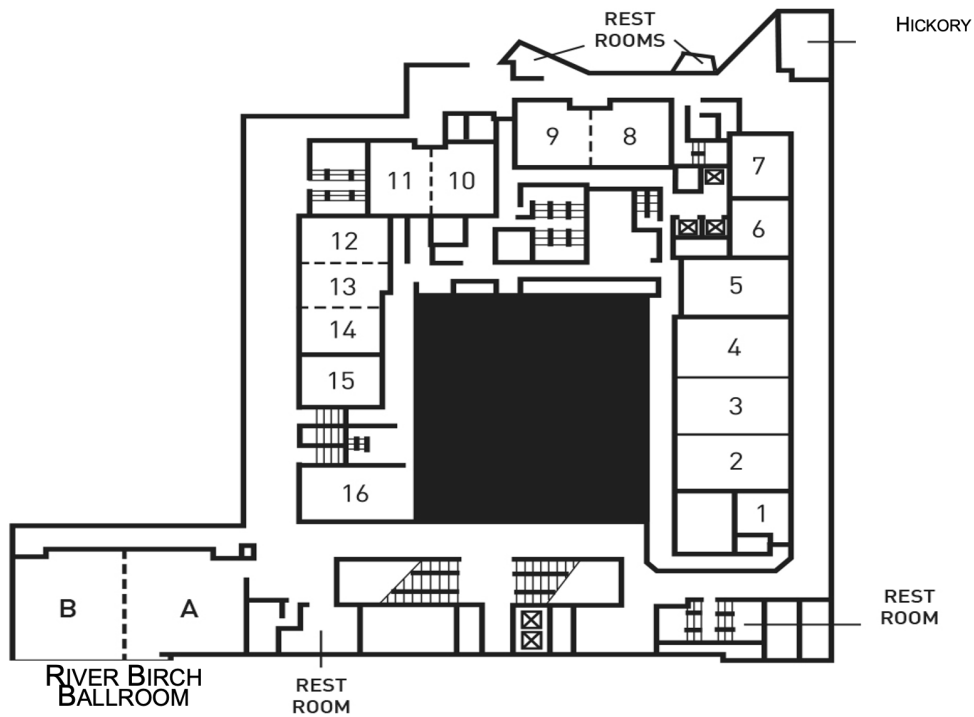

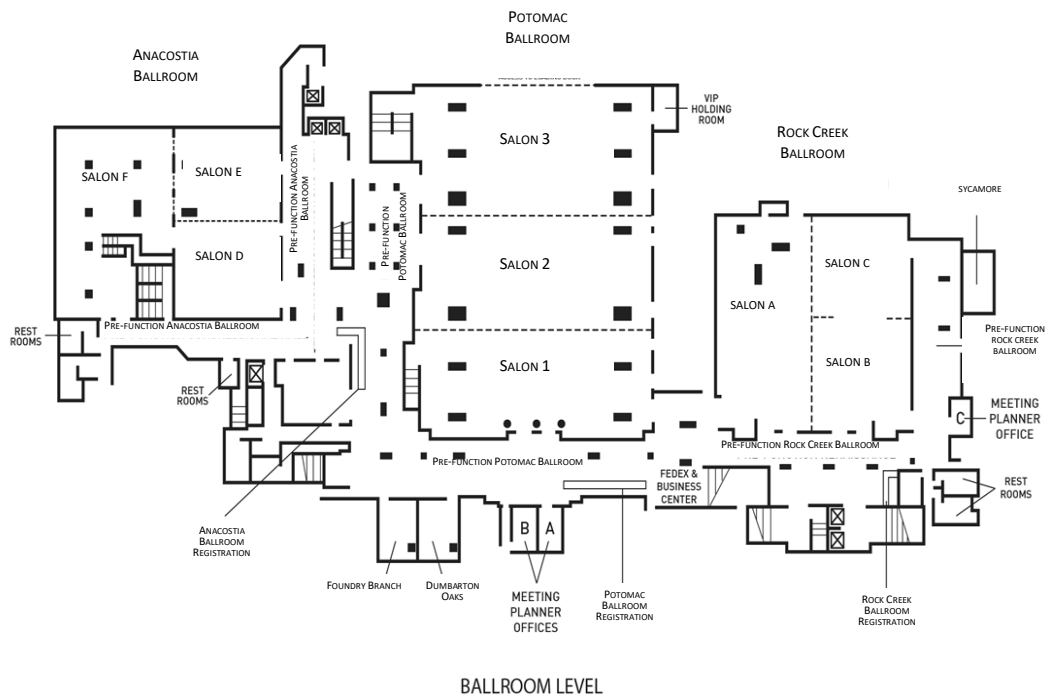
